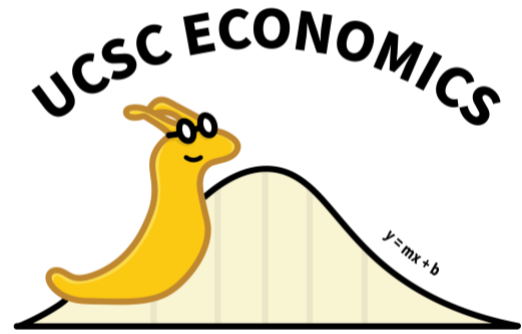


## How to be Successful in Economics (Transfers)

1. AM 11B (for all courses): Utilize all campus resources available to you (attend all lectures, sections, faculty/TA office hours, MSI drop-in tutoring, LSS, form study groups through Navigate if needed); take advantage of all extra credit opportunities (participation in sections and class lectures, retake quizzes to get highest grade possible). If you have any questions about this class, meet with us!
2. Meet with an undergraduate staff adviser or peer adviser as soon as possible for assistance in creating an academic planning form and to officially declare your major.
3. Attend department welcome events, field study orientations and other quarterly opportunities offered (faculty colloquium, M.S. program info. session, etc.); get involved and make connections.
4. Get help from the start, don't wait until you are in crisis mode.
5. If you are looking for professional development and ways to better prepare and represent yourself to the job market, meet with Sheila, professional development and field study coordinator, sooner than later.
6. Come see us as often as you like – we have a team of four advisers who are here to support you. We also have a team of 11 peer advisers who are also a great resource for you. You have NO excuse to not see someone.
