#### **Get ready for Writing 1 and/or Writing 2.** <del>\*</del>

Writing 1 is an important course. It is not available to students with certain test scores, even if they want to take it.

### Classes build slowly.

Writing classes are organized around writing projects. Smaller, low-stakes assignments lead to bigger projects. Writing classes don't have "midterms and a final," and it's crucial that you *attend* your writing classes.

You can connect with Writing Assistants, who will be paired with your class or available for drop-in tutoring. Tutoring is for *all* students!
