





UCSC STUDENTS ARE SUPPORTED WITH PROGRAMS AND SERVICES THAT HELP THEM ACHIEVE THEIR ACADEMIC GOALS AND MAINTAIN A SENSE OF WELL-BEING.

**EOP** (Educational Opportunity Programs) provides various academic and personal support programs to first-generation and low-income students from historically marginalized backgrounds.

LSS (Learning Support Services) offers inclusive tutoring sessions facilitated by peers.

CAPS (Counseling and Psychological Services) helps students learn how to manage stressors, build new skills, increase confidence, and resolve problems with individual and group mental health services.

THE DISABILITY RESOURCE CENTER provides a wide range of services and accommodations to help ensure that students with disabilities have equal access to the education and student life at UCSC.

GLOBAL ENGAGEMENT supports international students on campus and UCSC students who study abroad or participate in global internships.








#### LIONEL CANTÚ QUEER CENTER

# ADMISSION TO UC SANTA CRUZ

As a selective campus, UC Santa Cruz is unable to offer admission to all UC-qualified applicants.

#### MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

**COMPLETE 15 COLLEGE-PREPARATORY** COURSES ("A-G" COURSES)\*.

**CALIFORNIA STUDENTS: EARN A 3.00+ GRADE-POINT AVERAGE (GPA) IN** "A-G" COURSES WITH NO GRADE LOWER THAN A C.

UC Santa Cruz does not use standardized exam scores (ACT/SAT) in our holistic review and selection process.



## INTERNATIONAL FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

In addition to qualifying for UC via the process described above, you must meet the nonresident GPA of 3.40 or higher, and meet other requirements specific to your home country. UC Santa Cruz has an English Proficiency Requirement.







#### **OUT-OF-STATE FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS**

As an out-of-state applicant, you will need to meet the same requirements as a California-resident student, and you must meet the nonresident GPA of 3.40 or higher.







#### **COMPUTER SCIENCE**

(FIRST YEARS & TRANSFERS)

If you are interested in computer science you must select the major as your first choice on the UC Application. You are encouraged to have a solid background in advanced high school or college mathematics. If you were not selected for computer science, you may be reviewed for admission to an alternate major if you had one on the application. Whether you are a first year or a transfer, you will not be able to switch to computer science after you've enrolled at UCSC.

Does my major have minimum requirements I need to meet? Don't be caught unprepared!

# 胃 TRANSFER ADMISSION

UC Santa Cruz welcomes transfer students from community colleges and from other four year institutions. Junior-level transfer students from California community colleges receive priority admission, but lower-division applicants and second baccalaureate applicants will be considered, depending on the strength of the application and capacity during that term.

#### **MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS**

- Complete at least 60 semester units or 90 quarter units of UCtransferable coursework.
- Complete a UC-transferable 7-course pattern with minimum C (2.00) grades. Each course must be at least 3 semester units/4 quarter units.
- Earn a 2.40 overall UC GPA. Higher GPAs are more competitive.
- Complete required lower-division courses with the required grades/ GPA for the intended major.
